P R O C E E D I N G S

██████████ All right. It's March 2nd,
2022, 10:10 a.m. I'm ██████████ along with Special
Agent ██████ and we are with Jason --

What's your last name Jason?

MR. HALL: Hall.

██████████ Hall. On case 21-699.

Okay. Jason, we want to talk to you about
why we're here.

MR. HALL: Okay.

██████████ Obviously, we are serving a
search warrant on the business like we explained,
okay. We also have a search warrant for your phone
and any of your computers in the business. Okay.
And we'll explain kind of why. You probably know
why, is my guess.

Okay. But -- and again, we'll answer any
questions for you as well, if you want. Okay. But
before we talk to you, we need to advise you of your
rights because you're not free to leave right now.
Okay.

MALE SPEAKER: Yeah.

██████████ You understand that?

MR. HALL: Sure.

1 [REDACTED] Okay. (Inaudible) in there.

2 Okay. Like I say, we have a search
3 warrant for your phone. We'll provide that to you.
4 Here's a search warrant for the business, your phone
5 and you and your truck as well.

6 MR. HALL: Can I get my credit card out of
7 the back of it?

8 [REDACTED] We'll grab it.

9 MR. HALL: Just pop the case open.

10 [REDACTED] Okay.

11 MR. HALL: I didn't bring my wallet today,
12 so --

13 [REDACTED] Yeah. We'll grab it.

14 What's the passcode to the phone?

15 MR. HALL: Am I required to give that to
16 you?

17 [REDACTED] We have a court order, sir,
18 to search your phone. So, yeah.

19 MR. HALL: Okay. [REDACTED]

20 [REDACTED] Thank you. All right.

21 Jason, you have the right to remain
22 silent. Anything you say can be used against you in
23 a court of law.

24 You have the right to have an attorney
25 present as we talk. If you can't afford an attorney,

1 one will be provided to you. Okay.

2 At any time as we -- at any time as we
3 talk, if you decide to exercise those rights, you
4 can. What that means is we can talk and then if you
5 decide not to -- or not answer any questions, you can
6 -- you can choose that. Okay.

7 Do you understand your rights?

8 MR. HALL: I do.

9 [REDACTED] Okay. With those rights in
10 mind, do you want to talk?

11 MR. HALL: Potentially.

12 [REDACTED] Okay. Like I said, you can
13 decide at any point to not.

14 MR. HALL: Okay.

15 [REDACTED] Let me just get some quick
16 info. What's your phone number?

17 MR. HALL: My what?

18 [REDACTED] Your phone number.

19 MR. HALL: My cell phone, I'm assuming.

20 [REDACTED] Yeah.

21 MR. HALL: [REDACTED].

22 [REDACTED] Okay. And your e-mail.

23 MR. HALL: Jason at -- or sorry, [REDACTED]

24 [REDACTED] [REDACTED].

25 MR. HALL: Uh-huh (affirmative).

1 [REDACTED]
2 [REDACTED] Okay. Do you have any
3 others?
4 MR. HALL: [REDACTED]
5 [REDACTED] Okay. And any others?
6 MR. HALL: No, not really.
7 [REDACTED] Not really.
8 MR. HALL: Those are my business.
9 [REDACTED] Okay. Any other e-mails that
10 you've set up in the last year?
11 MR. HALL: No.
12 [REDACTED] Okay. All right.
13 Do you know why we're here?
14 MR. HALL: More or less.
15 [REDACTED] Okay. You've talked to
16 [REDACTED] right?
17 MR. HALL: Yeah.
18 [REDACTED] Okay. So you know that we --
19 we visited with [REDACTED] --
20 MR. HALL: I do.
21 [REDACTED] -- a few months ago.
22 Do you know why?
23 MR. HALL: I do.
24 [REDACTED] Okay. Do you know what he
25 told us? Did he tell you what he told us?

1 MR. HALL: He just -- well, I don't know
2 what all he told he you. He told me why you visited
3 him.

4 [REDACTED] Okay. Now, Jason, we
5 wouldn't be here if we already didn't have evidence
6 to show that you were involved. Okay. Even beyond
7 what [REDACTED] told us. All right. I mean, he told
8 us --

9 MR. HALL: Sure.

10 [REDACTED] -- that you were involved.

11 So we're not going to be -- we're not
12 here, necessarily, to ask you what you did. Okay.
13 We more or less want to find out why. Okay. And
14 kind of what's going on. Okay.

15 But we've served search warrants on your
16 G-mail accounts, so anything associated with your
17 Google account we have. Okay. Like I say, [REDACTED]
18 kind of already told us.

19 To be frank, I get that this guy is a bit
20 of a dink. So I get some anger, so we get that.
21 Okay. But we need to know the full scope of this and
22 what's going on. Okay.

23 MR. HALL: Yeah.

24 [REDACTED] All right. So if you just
25 want to start at the beginning and kind of tell us

1 what's going on.

2 MR. HALL: Yeah. You guys give me a
3 minute to read through this?

4 [REDACTED] Yeah. I'm just not going to
5 have any -- other than what we're searching -- but
6 like I said, we're searching the truck, we're
7 searching your phone, we're searching your computers,
8 and again, the business for those items. And then
9 here's a copy of the warrant for your G-mail account
10 that we served.

11 And then there's a copy of the warrant on
12 this [REDACTED] account that was associated with
13 you and your accounts, as well, so --

14 And again, we're not here to judge. We --
15 we get anger. We get competition.

16 [REDACTED] And kind of like what he was
17 mentioning as well is, you know, we've seen what's in
18 the e-mails, we've seen the contents, whether or not
19 things are going to be followed through on, that's
20 what we're here to find out, okay, and to get some
21 context about what we're dealing with which I'm sure
22 is something you probably want us to know what you
23 actually thought, right?

24 [REDACTED] Like, is there intent to hurt
25 somebody? Is there just threats? Is there just

1 trying to get rid of a bug?

2 Well, and so you know, too, you're not
3 going to jail today, regardless. Okay. We are
4 detaining you now but we're not -- you're not going
5 to jail today, so --

6 MR. HALL: I'm not worried about that.

7 [REDACTED] Okay.

8 MR. HALL: So I think you guys are off
9 base a little bit here.

10 [REDACTED] Okay. Tell us where we're
11 off base.

12 MR. HALL: Well, you believe that I have,
13 on several occasions, threatened the life of Jeff
14 Gaston. So let me ask you a question -- and I don't
15 know if this is -- if you're at liberty to say this
16 but, clearly, you wouldn't be here making this whole
17 scene if you didn't think so. But you've seen
18 evidence that brings you to the conclusion, not the
19 supposition or the guess but let's find out and
20 verify, but the conclusion that I have threatened his
21 life.

22 [REDACTED] Yep.

23 MR. HALL: Because that is just not
24 correct.

25 [REDACTED] We have probable cause to

1 believe that you're involved in the threats to him.
2 Yep. That's why we're here.

3 MR. HALL: Probable cause.

4 [REDACTED] Yep. That's the legal term.
5 That's what we -- that's what we go by is the
6 probable cause.

7 MR. HALL: I guess you're right.

8 [REDACTED] That's where a judge --
9 (Multiple voices.)

10 [REDACTED] And if we're wrong, that's why
11 we're here to talk to you is to find out how we're
12 wrong and to help us show that we're wrong.

13 [REDACTED] But you know [REDACTED] -- we
14 know [REDACTED] talked to you.

15 MR. HALL: Yeah.

16 [REDACTED] So we know you know why we're
17 here.

18 MR. HALL: I know why you're here.

19 [REDACTED] So if you want to -- if you
20 want to tell us where we're wrong --

21 (Multiple voices.)

22 MR. HALL: I've -- I've had my attorney --

23 [REDACTED] -- this is your -- this is
24 your chance --

25 MR. HALL: -- reach out to [REDACTED] on five

1 different occasions to say, "What the hell is going
2 on? Do you guys want to come -- do you want to talk
3 about this?"

4 And he respond -- he finally called him
5 back and he just said, "There's nothing going on."

6 But that was recently and I guess that's
7 --

8 [REDACTED] Okay.

9 MR. HALL: -- that's not the case.

10 [REDACTED] Listen, Jeff, we're not going
11 to sit here and go back and forth.

12 MR. HALL: Sure.

13 [REDACTED] Okay. Okay. Right now we
14 have a warrant based on probable cause --

15 MR. HALL: Okay.

16 [REDACTED] -- that you're involved in
17 this. Okay. We're not going to sit here and dance.
18 I can tell you that right now.

19 So if you want to talk to us, you can.

20 MR. HALL: Okay.

21 [REDACTED] If you don't want to talk to
22 us, we're done. We don't care. Truthfully --
23 truthfully, we have probable cause to book you into
24 jail right now. Okay. We don't need you to tell us
25 what you did. That's what I'm telling you. We

1 already know what you did. Okay. We do. You can
2 roll your eyes all you want, okay, but we know.

3 So the question is: Do you want to talk
4 to us? We're not going to dance. We're not going to
5 sit here and dance with you.

6 MR. HALL: Well, I'm happy to talk to you.

7 [REDACTED] Okay. So start at the
8 beginning. Tell us what's going on.

9 MR. HALL: Okay. So, first of all, I have
10 never threatened the life of Jeff Gaston.

11 [REDACTED] Okay.

12 MR. HALL: I have never threatened
13 violence against Jeff Gaston.

14 Now, if you guys have all this evidence,
15 then you know that my MO on all this stuff that I've
16 been involved in is nothing more than mockery.

17 [REDACTED] Okay. So tell us what you've
18 done. Tell us what you've done and we can parse out
19 what you were involved in versus what you weren't
20 involved in. Okay.

21 MR. HALL: So let's start with the box, as
22 it's been come to known as around city hall. So
23 around March of last year he had a -- there was a
24 city council meeting. It got pretty heated.
25 Everybody was all up in arms about some land

1 development deal. And as the city council is going
2 through, you know, the procedures of passing or not
3 passing, he stands up and starts threatening the
4 mayor, "I'm going to sue you," doing all this, you
5 know, just, frankly, making an ass of himself.

6 [REDACTED] And he's a councilman, right?

7 MR. HALL: He's a councilman. That's
8 correct.

9 So he's doing this all on public record in
10 front of 100 people, you know, this room is packed.
11 Just making a fool of himself and, frankly, the whole
12 process.

13 So -- and my wife worked at city hall.
14 So, clever me, I thought it would be funny to send a
15 gift package to city hall, a city council survival
16 kit. So have you seen the pictures of this? Okay.
17 So they all included gifts to the city council
18 including Councilman Gaston of different items in
19 which it would be helpful should a certain councilman
20 have any more fits, you know, like a toddler. So
21 they were all baby gifts, binkies, blankets, fruit
22 snacks, a bottle, that kind of thing.

23 [REDACTED] Uh-huh (affirmative).

24 MR. HALL: Eye glasses so that the other
25 councilmen could hide themselves while they rolled

1 their eyes while he's up grandstanding -- because
2 that was the other thing, he gets up after the vote
3 of this one thing that made him mad and, "I will
4 never stop fighting" -- you know, this is after he's
5 threatening the mayor and this whole bit so --
6 anyway, so I send a few things to the city council to
7 basically get a laugh and to make fun of the guy.
8 That's it. So --

9 [REDACTED] Okay. How many other
10 packages did you send?

11 MR. HALL: So then I sent one to his house
12 that was a children's anger management coloring book
13 with a note that said, "I thought this might help
14 with your issues."

15 [REDACTED] Which -- kind of funny.
16 Okay.

17 MR. HALL: And --
18 (Multiple voices.)

19 [REDACTED] I get it. I get it.

20 MR. HALL: Kind of funny, just -- kind of
21 needling the guy a little bit.

22 And then recently -- well, not recently.
23 I guess, this was back in November when I probably
24 should have just left well enough alone. He had --
25 so I'm sure you're familiar with all of his

1 investigations into my wife as she ran for mayor.

2 Have you guys looked into all that?

3 [REDACTED] Yeah.

4 MR. HALL: Okay.

5 [REDACTED] And you should know, by the
6 way, we don't -- I've never met him personally.

7 MR. HALL: Okay.

8 [REDACTED] So I got no buy in on him.
9 And I understand the --

10 MR. HALL: Sure.

11 [REDACTED] I understand the -- he pokes
12 the nest a little bit and so -- yeah. I get it.

13 MR. HALL: So you've seen all the
14 investigations.

15 [REDACTED] Yep.

16 MR. HALL: I just don't know how much due
17 diligence you guys have done.

18 [REDACTED] We've done everything --

19 MR. HALL: How thorough it is.

20 [REDACTED] This is the last step. We
21 don't do this until the end.

22 (Multiple voices.)

23 MR. HALL: So he sends -- or -- yeah, so
24 over the course of this whole deal, he launches all
25 these investigations, you know, because he had

1 aspirations to run for mayor at some point and
2 instead, at the last minute, I guess he decides to
3 support this other guy and kind of -- whatever. At
4 every step, he's just trying to knock her down, talk
5 crap about her, whatever, and he's launches into
6 these BS investigations trying to make her look
7 embarrassed.

8 And at one point --

9 [REDACTED] Sorry, was she -- she was a
10 candidate by this point, right? Was she? Or was she
11 still --

12 MR. HALL: She had --

13 [REDACTED] -- talking --

14 (Multiple voices.)

15 MR. HALL: She had let him know, and the
16 other council members, that she had intents to run
17 for mayor. Now, nobody is a technical candidate
18 until --

19 [REDACTED] Until they file --

20 MR. HALL: -- July when they file.

21 So at any rate, he had started letting
22 some rumors fly to -- around at office and other
23 council members that he had in his possession a
24 letter accusing my wife of having an affair with the
25 city manager. Well, that finally kind of gets back

1 around to my wife who flips out, talks to the city
2 manager, who is a great man, and they're just -- I
3 mean, they're both just so taken aback and like what
4 do you want to do? And she's like, investigate this
5 immediately. And so they do, investigate the whole
6 thing. It all comes to not. Nobody believes a word
7 of it. So here he is accusing my wife of sleeping
8 with the city manager to get favors and whatnot.

9 Again, I didn't -- I just let that be.
10 But after the election and when I should have left
11 well enough alone because my wife is furious about
12 this whole thing now, I sent him a court jester's hat
13 with a note that said, "You've earned this."

14 [REDACTED] Where are you buying all
15 this?

16 MR. HALL: Oh, just Amazon.

17 [REDACTED] Oh, okay, just going to
18 Amazon.

19 MR. HALL: Yeah. So --

20 [REDACTED] Sorry to interrupt.

21 [REDACTED] No, you're good.

22 [REDACTED] Your computer in your office has
23 a pin on it. Can I get that so I can properly shut
24 it down? If not, then I'm just going to --

25 MR. HALL: Are you guys taking my

1 computer?

2 [REDACTED] It's been seized as part of the
3 search warrant.

4 MR. HALL: Christ. That runs my business.

5 [REDACTED] What's that?

6 MR. HALL: That runs my business.

7 [REDACTED] The quicker he can --

8 [REDACTED] Yeah.

9 [REDACTED] -- confirm there's nothing on
10 this, we can get it back to you.

11 MR. HALL: Yeah.

12 [REDACTED] Okay. But -- and that's
13 where the password comes in, too --

14 [REDACTED] My concern is if I unplug it, if
15 you have anything on there that needs to be saved,
16 it's not going to save.

17 MR. HALL: Yeah. It's [REDACTED].

18 [REDACTED] Okay.

19 MR. HALL: Can I back up my QuickBooks
20 before you guys off with it?

21 [REDACTED] Yeah. I don't think they want
22 us touching anything on it at this point. It's just
23 kind of -- (inaudible) as it is right now.

24 [REDACTED] And once we can confirm
25 there's nothing on it, we can get it back to you. So

1 that's --

2 MR. HALL: How -- how long does that take?
3 Because I've got payroll next week and that's the
4 only computer that runs my payroll.

5 ██████████ Okay. Let's -- we'll -- let
6 me -- when we're done --

7 MR. HALL: Sure.

8 ██████████ -- I'll go talk to my
9 computer forensic guy and see kind of what --

10 MR. HALL: Dig in, feel free, I don't care
11 but --

12 Anyway -- then I sent another thing to
13 city hall. I can't remember which one I sent to
14 which. Anyway, there was a hat and a little tapestry
15 of the tarot card the fool.

16 ██████████ Uh-huh (affirmative).

17 MR. HALL: Anyway --

18 ██████████ Now, are you delivering all
19 these? Are you having ██████████ deliver some?

20 ██████████ We know ██████████ delivered some.

21 MR. HALL: Yeah, so --

22 (Multiple voices.)

23 MR. HALL: I had him run a couple to the
24 mail -- to the post office for me and I think that's
25 where he -- you guys wrapped him up in this whole

1 thing. So he had nothing to do with anything other
2 than running an errand for me, so --

3 [REDACTED] Well, he knew enough to cover
4 his license plate with cardboard, right?

5 MR. HALL: Yeah.

6 [REDACTED] Okay. So he knew that he was
7 doing something.

8 MR. HALL: And I think I probably told him
9 --

10 [REDACTED] Did you tell him to do that?

11 MR. HALL: Yeah.

12 [REDACTED] Why did you tell him to do
13 that?

14 MR. HALL: Well, because from what I know
15 of this guy -- of course, I'm not breaking the law,
16 I'm delivering a funny, goofy package. But I knew
17 that if this came back and --

18 [REDACTED] It's not going to look good,
19 right?

20 MR. HALL: It's not going to look good to
21 my wife.

22 [REDACTED] Your wife. Yeah.

23 MR. HALL: And that's what I'm afraid of.
24 I'm not afraid of you guys, I'm afraid of my wife
25 being super pissed and boy, was she. I find -- you

1 know, just --

2 [REDACTED] What did she say?

3 MR. HALL: Oh, she was so mad.

4 [REDACTED] How did she find out?

5 MR. HALL: I told her.

6 [REDACTED] Okay.

7 MR. HALL: I told her. Well, after the
8 whole thing, you know --

9 [REDACTED] After [REDACTED] you mean?

10 MR. HALL: Yeah. That whole thing. I
11 said, "Hey, just so you know, here's what's going on.
12 And I'm sure these guys are going to come talk to
13 me." And she was, you know, livid. I'm sure you can
14 imagine.

15 [REDACTED] Yeah.

16 MR. HALL: Anyway, so that whole thing.
17 But yeah, I mean, he hadn't -- he had nothing to do
18 with it other than dropping off the package for me
19 and running the thing to the mail which, I mean, he
20 -- that's all he does is run errands and do tasks and
21 all that kind of stuff for me, so that's -- anyway --

22 [REDACTED] All right. So --

23 MR. HALL: I'm hoping that for whatever --
24 for whatever this is worth -- and I know you guys
25 took a bunch of his crap and all that. And I'm

1 hoping that can be made right because he literally
2 had nothing to do other than running some stuff to
3 the post office for me. So he -- he doesn't know who
4 any of these people are.

5 (Multiple voices.)

6 MR. HALL: He -- and he was on the clock
7 doing -- doing a task for his boss. That's --

8 [REDACTED] Just running errands like --

9 (Multiple voices.)

10 MR. HALL: Yeah.

11 [REDACTED] All right. So tell us about

12 [REDACTED].

13 MR. HALL: So, after the meeting --

14 [REDACTED] This is back in March, right?

15 MR. HALL: Yeah. After the meeting, I
16 honestly was -- and I think I sent him in e-mail
17 before I sent him the box, just disgusted with his
18 behavior. I've never seen anything like this in our
19 little sleepy town of Bluffdale.

20 And, you know, you've read through the
21 e-mail. So I sent him an e-mail saying, "Dude,
22 basically, how about toning it down a little bit and
23 have a little decorum and a little respect for our
24 city." That was the gist of the whole thing. And of
25 course, I'm throwing little things in there to kind

1 of throw off the scent of who it is that's sending it
2 and --

3 [REDACTED] Why [REDACTED]?

4 Is your wife a Democrat or Republican? I
5 don't remember.

6 Did she -- did she run as a --

7 MR. HALL: She's a registered Republican
8 but local politics don't -- they're not partisan.

9 (Multiple voices.)

10 [REDACTED] She's not -- okay. All
11 right.

12 MR. HALL: Just because it sounded -- I
13 don't know, just sounded --

14 [REDACTED] Did [REDACTED] --

15 MR. HALL: [REDACTED], you know.

16 [REDACTED] Did he have any involvement
17 in setting that up or --

18 MR. HALL: No.

19 [REDACTED] Setting -- did anybody else
20 use that?

21 MR. HALL: No. It's just me.

22 [REDACTED] It was just you. Because the
23 reason we're here is because you --

24 MR. HALL: Yeah.

25 [REDACTED] Yeah.

1 MR. HALL: "I hope this helps with your
2 issues, buddy."

3 [REDACTED] I'm not going to argue it's
4 not funny. And again -- and I know he -- I know from
5 what I hear he can poke --

6 MR. HALL: Yeah, so -- oh --
7 (Multiple voices.)

8 MR. HALL: Yeah, there's --

9 [REDACTED] Well, let me tell you --

10 MR. HALL: There's a whole other set of
11 things with him.

12 [REDACTED] With -- where did you print
13 all this stuff out on? What computer?

14 MR. HALL: Probably just my computer.

15 [REDACTED] Here --

16 MR. HALL: At the other building.

17 [REDACTED] Okay. Which computer,
18 though? Do you have a new computer?

19 MR. HALL: This is a new computer.

20 [REDACTED] Where's the old one?

21 MR. HALL: It died.

22 [REDACTED] It just died?

23 MR. HALL: Yeah. It was 14 years old.

24 [REDACTED] Okay. So everything you
25 printed all this on is on an old computer that died.

1 MR. HALL: Yeah.

2 [REDACTED] And where is that computer?

3 MR. HALL: Landfill somewhere.

4 [REDACTED] Okay. When did you get rid

5 of it?

6 MR. HALL: Couple months ago. We were

7 having major problems with it and so I upgraded, got

8 a new one.

9 [REDACTED] Okay. This is after [REDACTED]

10 talked to you?

11 MR. HALL: Probably.

12 [REDACTED] Did that concern you?

13 MR. HALL: Not really.

14 [REDACTED] What about this phone? Is

15 this a new phone?

16 MR. HALL: No.

17 MALE SPEAKER: Yeah.

18 MR. HALL: I've actually looked for

19 pictures of that.

20 [REDACTED] Well, we got them for you.

21 MR. HALL: All right.

22 [REDACTED] So -- yeah. And there's him

23 delivering those packages for you.

24 So you said you never threatened his life.

25 MR. HALL: Nope. I sure didn't.

1 ██████████ Okay. So we have the
2 e-mails --
3 MR. HALL: Okay. And you found anything
4 in that e-mail that was --
5 ██████████ -- saying that, "We're going
6 to kill you."
7 MR. HALL: -- life threatening.
8 ██████████ Saying that, "If you don't,
9 you'll end up dead." Saying --
10 MR. HALL: Absolutely not.
11 ██████████ Well, they're all from the
12 ██████████ e-mail.
13 MR. HALL: That's -- certainly not.
14 (Multiple voices.)
15 ██████████ -- packages. They are. We
16 have them.
17 MR. HALL: That is not correct.
18 ██████████ Where -- where do you think
19 we got these from?
20 MR. HALL: Can you -- can you show me this
21 stuff?
22 ██████████ I'm looking --
23 MR. HALL: So -- I'd like to see it
24 because something is not adding up here.
25 ██████████ Well, you'll see it in

1 discovery. But what I'm saying is we wouldn't be
2 here for joker hats. That's not -- that's not even a
3 crime.

4 MR. HALL: That's what I'm so confused
5 about.

6 [REDACTED] Okay.

7 MR. HALL: I know.

8 [REDACTED] But threats on life is a
9 crime.

10 MR. HALL: I absolutely understand that.

11 [REDACTED] And that's why we're here.
12 Again, we wouldn't be here without those.

13 MR. HALL: So -- so let me give you a
14 little context.

15 [REDACTED] Okay.

16 MR. HALL: And you -- you know, you can
17 decide if this fits into your -- your current
18 narrative or if there's a little more information
19 that you need to discover. So --

20 (Multiple voices.)

21 [REDACTED] -- "apologize or kill
22 yourself" -- this isn't a package you sent.

23 MR. HALL: Huh?

24 [REDACTED] "Apologize or kill yourself."

25 MR. HALL: That is absolutely a lie.

1 [REDACTED] "If you can't do that, then
2 maybe you will just end up being killed. It's time
3 for you to start watching your back." That's on the
4 package you just confirmed you sent.

5 MR. HALL: On what package?

6 [REDACTED] March 9th, package.

7 MR. HALL: That is falsified.

8 [REDACTED] That's falsified.

9 MR. HALL: That is absolutely falsified.
10 Now, it's on the package?

11 [REDACTED] It's in the package.

12 MR. HALL: It absolutely was not.

13 [REDACTED] Okay. So how are we going to
14 show that? Because there's threats in the e-mail,
15 too.

16 MR. HALL: What threats are in the e-mail?
17 (Multiple voices.)

18 [REDACTED] -- that you confirmed -- I
19 just read them to you. I just read one to you.

20 MR. HALL: That was not in that e-mail.

21 [REDACTED] We have -- we served a search
22 warrant on the e-mail account.

23 MR. HALL: I don't know what to tell you.
24 Never did I say that in any of these e-mails.

25 [REDACTED] Who else --

1 MR. HALL: If you look at the tone of this
2 e-mail, of all -- of any of those e-mails, it was all
3 --

4 [REDACTED] We've got them all.

5 (Multiple voices.)

6 MR. HALL: -- jabbing, poking fun at --
7 begging him to return to civil discourse. I didn't
8 threaten the guy's life.

9 [REDACTED] Jason, who else knew about that
10 e-mail?

11 MR. HALL: No one.

12 [REDACTED] Who else had access to that
13 e-mail that could have logged on your computer --

14 MR. HALL: No one that I know of.

15 [REDACTED] Were those -- was that -- were
16 those e-mails from that that we're talking about, was
17 that sent from your phone or from a computer?

18 MR. HALL: It was from that old computer.

19 [REDACTED] Can you think of a way that
20 somebody could have falsified those e-mails?

21 MR. HALL: Okay. So --

22 [REDACTED] Because when we say we served a
23 search warrant, that means we got it directly from --

24 MR. HALL: From -- from the.

25 [REDACTED] From the provider, right? Not

1 from him coming forward and saying here's the e-mail.
2 We get those from -- from the actual company itself.

3 MR. HALL: It's not a printed --

4 [REDACTED] Well, again, we -- we get
5 stuff from the accuser.

6 MR. HALL: Sure.

7 [REDACTED] And then we go to the
8 accounts which that's what we have warrants here to
9 get from the provider.

10 [REDACTED] So, it's Google, we go to -- we
11 go to Google and say --

12 MR. HALL: Sure.

13 [REDACTED] And they say, "Here it is."

14 MR. HALL: And you're saying that the
15 thing that you got from Google from [REDACTED] whatever
16 that was at Bluffdale --

17 [REDACTED] Have threats. So you're
18 saying you never threatened him.

19 MR. HALL: Absolutely not.

20 [REDACTED] Did you ever assault him?

21 MR. HALL: No.

22 [REDACTED] Okay. What happened at the
23 summer activity, the summer -- tell us about that
24 confrontation.

25 MR. HALL: Did he say I assaulted him?

1 [REDACTED] Yes.

2 MR. HALL: Well, I had a confrontation
3 with him.

4 [REDACTED] Yeah, he did.

5 MR. HALL: Yeah, so that didn't happen.

6 [REDACTED] Okay. What happened?

7 MR. HALL: So, again, it's like the sleepy
8 town politics. So my wife has her booth, his guy has
9 his booth 50 feet away and behind us is an open
10 booth. So at some point, halfway through the day --
11 so they have this town -- you know, it's town days,
12 everybody -- community is walking around talking to
13 people. He walks up to this empty spot behind us, so
14 there's my wife, kind of an empty spot and then one
15 of the other councilmen -- council aides that was
16 rerunning for -- for her seat.

17 So it's been going since nine o'clock and
18 about one o'clock he comes over and starts putting up
19 a chair -- so we've got signs and the signs so that
20 people coming this way can see. So he starts putting
21 up a chair with a big umbrella and signs blocking the
22 view of our thing. I'm like, really? So he's
23 dragging stuff over from this other booth. The guy's
24 booth is 50 feet away, it's like anybody who wants to
25 talk --

1 (Multiple voices.)

2 [REDACTED] What's he dragging, just --

3 MR. HALL: Just --

4 (Multiple voices.)

5 MR. HALL: So he -- so he's picking up
6 more signs and coming, like, to, "Uh, I'm going to
7 block the view so people can't see her booth." Like,
8 just really sad. And so I'm sit -- I'm like are you
9 shitting me? So, finally, I'm just like that's it,
10 I've had enough. So I pick up this stuff, and I
11 think at that point it was just a couple of signs. I
12 pick it up and I start walking back to the other
13 guy's booth and he's walking now this way.

14 I'm like, "Dude, what are you doing?" Or
15 something to that effect. I'm like, "Get this stuff
16 out of here." I'm like, "Come on."

17 "Back off. You back off. Get away from
18 me. And you better -- don't touch me."

19 I'm like, "I'm not touching you."

20 Anyway, so we kind of get into it for a
21 second and -- and he's like, "You better back off.
22 You better back off." And he's like, "This is my
23 booth."

24 I'm like, "Since when? Like, this booth
25 has been empty" --

1 "This is my booth. I always rent this
2 booth."

3 I'm like, "All right, whatever."

4 And he's like, "You better back off.
5 Don't touch me."

6 And I'm like, "Oh yeah, I better back
7 off." I said, "After the crap you've done to my
8 wife."

9 "I haven't done anything to your wife.
10 I've" --

11 I'm like, "Uh-Huh (affirmative)." I said,
12 "All your little investigations."

13 "Well, I'm just following the law. I'm
14 just following the law."

15 And I just -- and finally I'm -- at this
16 point, I'm just like whatever. And you know, we're
17 back into the -- into that space right next to my
18 wife's booth. So, finally, I'm like -- I just went,
19 "Whatever, dude." I'm like, "You know what, you're
20 fucking pathetic." And I just turned around --

21 "Ah," you know, he flips out, goes runs
22 and grabs the public works guy that's in charge of
23 it.

24 And comes over and, "I'm sorry, Jeff," and
25 anyway.

1 So then we -- he and I --

2 [REDACTED] He makes you say you're
3 sorry, is that --

4 MR. HALL: No. No. No.

5 [REDACTED] Well, he says he's sorry.

6 MR. HALL: No. No. No. No. No.

7 So that --

8 (Multiple voices.)

9 MR. HALL: So the public works guy is a
10 guy named [REDACTED], so I -- he's like, "Hey, you know,
11 we can't have -- well, we can't have any" -- you
12 know, Jeff's like, "We can't have this kind of
13 confrontation or conflict."

14 And finally I'm just like, this is so not
15 worth it. I just said, "Hey, you know what, I'm
16 sorry. If that was your booth, if you rented it and
17 paid for that booth, then, you know, my apologies."

18 And so -- and my wife is kind of like,
19 "Can you guys get out of here?" You know, she's
20 sitting there talking to people.

21 So I said, "Let's step aside for a
22 minute."

23 So we step aside and we talked for five,
24 ten minutes, you know. And I let him know, I'm like
25 -- I said, "After all the stuff that you've done," I

1 said, "You can imagine how it looks like you're just
2 being a dick?"

3 He's like, "Well, I can see that but, you
4 know, this is my booth."

5 "Fine," I said, "So my apologies if that's
6 your booth. But you can see how, you know, my
7 reaction."

8 And anyway so we talked about a couple
9 other things, you know, and about politics and we
10 shook hands at the end and that was that.

11 [REDACTED] Went on your way.

12 MR. HALL: Yeah.

13 [REDACTED] You didn't throw any signs,
14 you didn't --

15 MR. HALL: No. Oh, he went around telling
16 everyone that there was a big altercation. He's
17 really good at playing the victim.

18 [REDACTED] Right.

19 [REDACTED] But if there were other people
20 that saw this, would they support your --

21 MR. HALL: Well, sure.

22 [REDACTED] -- your statement?

23 MR. HALL: The other council lady and her
24 husband are sitting --

25 [REDACTED] Who was that? Which one?

1 MR. HALL: [REDACTED] [REDACTED].

2 Yeah.

3 [REDACTED] So they saw it all?

4 MR. HALL: Front row seat.

5 [REDACTED] Okay.

6 MR. HALL: Anyway, there was no
7 altercation. We didn't throw signs. I just picked
8 them up and I'm like, "Dude, get these out of here,
9 come on. Like, what are you doing?" You know, that
10 kind of thing.

11 [REDACTED] Okay.

12 MR. HALL: So, anyway, that was that. But
13 -- so here's the thing that you guys should know if
14 you want to dig in a little bit. So within days of
15 the box showing up --

16 [REDACTED] Which one?

17 MR. HALL: The --

18 [REDACTED] Earlier on?

19 MR. HALL: The survival kit.

20 [REDACTED] Okay. Yeah.

21 MR. HALL: Of course this makes him look
22 like a complete fool and the whole purpose of this
23 box was so that as soon as it got opened, without
24 opening the gift bags, what was inside was shown, you
25 know, the little instruction thing on the top of what

1 it's all for, the whole purpose was so that everyone
2 would see that and be like, holy crap. He did a
3 little whisper campaign and basically take the guy
4 down a notch because he runs around throwing fits
5 like a bully and, you know -- and people are like,
6 holy crap, this guy's -- he goes further than most
7 decent people are willing to go.

8 So, you know, to get everybody to kind of
9 laugh about the thing and be like, oh, yeah, he was
10 acting like a child. Just make fun of him a little
11 bit.

12 So right after that, he starts telling
13 people, oh, well, yeah, I'm getting death threats.
14 And people are going, death threats, like, who is
15 threatening the -- who is threatening the city
16 councilman? Like, in Bluffdale, who gives a crap?

17 "Oh, yeah, I get death threats all the
18 time."

19 And you know -- to the point where before
20 anybody knew that I was involved in that box, I heard
21 it from the councilman, I heard it from my wife, I
22 heard it from the city -- yeah, the city manager, you
23 know, like, he -- oh, yeah, he's been claiming death
24 threats ever since that box showed up. I mean,
25 within days, death threats, changing the -- the

1 narrative to instead of being made fun off, now he's
2 a victim.

3 [REDACTED] So he -- he was claiming that
4 and that started way back in March?

5 MR. HALL: He started telling people that
6 he gets death threats.

7 [REDACTED] After the first box.

8 MR. HALL: Right after that showed up.

9 [REDACTED] When did you hear -- when did
10 you hear that he was saying that?

11 MR. HALL: Oh, not too long after that. I
12 -- I don't remember.

13 [REDACTED] Okay.

14 MR. HALL: I don't have --

15 [REDACTED] Here's my question --
16 (Multiple voices.)

17 MR. HALL: -- short-term memory.

18 [REDACTED] If you knew -- if you're
19 claiming you didn't send the threats but you knew he
20 was claiming he was getting threats, why did you keep
21 sending him stuff at all? Why didn't you think: You
22 know what, maybe I ought to back off in case this
23 happens, right? Like --

24 (Multiple voices.)

25 MR. HALL: Probably would have been

1 smarter, admittedly.

2 [REDACTED] So even early on when he's
3 saying he's getting threats, you continued to send
4 him these --

5 MR. HALL: Well, I heard about that, you
6 know, later, but -- yeah. Then months go by, you
7 know --

8 [REDACTED] And you didn't send anything
9 for months.

10 [REDACTED] Why did you send stuff -- why
11 did you wait so long and then start it up again?

12 [REDACTED] What happened that --

13 MR. HALL: So he -- he went -- right
14 before the election, he started getting real feisty
15 with a bunch of people. Even threatened --
16 threatened our -- the city attorney, ended up having
17 -- there was a big investigation into that. I think
18 he actually faced a censure from the whole city
19 council, I don't know, anyway. That was all
20 closed-door stuff that -- you know, I happened to
21 drive by this, you know, while they were having a
22 closed-door meeting about them and he was sitting
23 outside just kind of, you know, waiting to get the
24 results of it. Well, you know, pretty big deal.

25 He -- so he threatens everybody that, "Oh,

1 you better make sure you're on the right side of this
2 when this goes down." That was like -- everybody
3 heard that after a city council --

4 [REDACTED] The right side of this --

5 MR. HALL: Election.

6 [REDACTED] Election.

7 MR. HALL: Basically. Basically, you
8 know, "If -- if this -- if my guy gets elected, you
9 know, you're going to" --

10 (Multiple voices.)

11 MR. HALL: That kind of thing. "You're
12 out of here," or whatever. So anyway, just the same
13 old stuff.

14 And then after my wife won, I couldn't
15 leave well enough alone. And that --

16 [REDACTED] I'm sure he's --

17 MR. HALL: -- was probably the dumbest
18 part of it.

19 (Multiple voices.)

20 [REDACTED] -- for her as the mayor, I'm
21 guessing, right?

22 MR. HALL: What's that?

23 [REDACTED] He's probably still a pain
24 for her.

25 MR. HALL: No, he actually hasn't been.

1 (Multiple voices.)

2 [REDACTED] -- councilman.

3 MR. HALL: And I don't know that he's --
4 you know, now he's got this whole thing going. He's
5 just kind of keeping all tight lipped, who knows. He
6 hasn't spoken to her other than the mandatory stuff
7 in the meetings.

8 She, you know -- in our city, the mayor
9 runs all the meetings and does all the stuff and
10 calls on the people to vote for whatever and --

11 (Multiple voices.)

12 [REDACTED] She hasn't even had issues with
13 him in the meetings really?

14 MR. HALL: No.

15 [REDACTED] He's kind of toned down a little
16 bit?

17 MR. HALL: Seems to. I mean, it's -- I
18 think there's only been, what is it? March. So
19 there's been a total of maybe four meetings so far,
20 so it hasn't been --

21 [REDACTED] Too -- too many.

22 MR. HALL: Hasn't been a big deal.

23 [REDACTED] So who else knew that you
24 were sending these packages?

25 MR. HALL: Oh, I think -- I told my

1 brother about it.

2 [REDACTED] [REDACTED] -- you told [REDACTED]?

3 MR. HALL: Yeah.

4 [REDACTED] Was he telling you that he
5 thought it was funny or did he think you probably --
6 (Multiple voices.)

7 MR. HALL: He thought it was funny. He
8 was just like -- his thing was, "Dude, make sure this
9 doesn't come back and affect our business."

10 And I'm like, "Yeah. No, it's -- it
11 shouldn't," until today I guess, so --

12 [REDACTED] Well, and again, and the
13 reason we're starting the warrant here is because --
14 is, you know, there's IP addresses associated with --

15 MR. HALL: Yeah.

16 [REDACTED] And it's all --

17 MR. HALL: The e-mails came from --
18 (Multiple voices.)

19 [REDACTED] -- come back to here and --

20 MR. HALL: Yeah. No, I get it.

21 [REDACTED] Otherwise, we wouldn't be
22 (inaudible).

23 MR. HALL: I get it.

24 (Multiple voices.)

25 [REDACTED] -- a business, so --

1 [REDACTED] So that old computer you said
2 you used to send those e-mails, were you here at the
3 -- at the business when you were sending those
4 e-mails?

5 MR. HALL: No. We just moved here
6 December.

7 [REDACTED] Just a little bit ago, huh?

8 MR. HALL: Yeah. We -- we bought the
9 building last year and then we just moved in just a
10 couple months ago.

11 [REDACTED] When did you get rid of that
12 computer?

13 MR. HALL: I bought this new one maybe a
14 month or -- month or two ago.

15 [REDACTED] So -- oh, sorry.

16 [REDACTED] Were you at your house, then,
17 using that old computer when you send those e-mails
18 from that cpac?

19 MR. HALL: No, that was at our old
20 building.

21 [REDACTED] At the old building.

22 MR. HALL: Yeah.

23 [REDACTED] Okay.

24 MR. HALL: Yeah. So anyway, the -- the
25 point is --

1 [REDACTED] Let me ask about the computer
2 real quick before we -- when you say it's in a
3 landfill somewhere, like, what did you do to get rid
4 of it? I mean, like, did you just throw it in the
5 dumpster or -- usually, what I'll do is pull my hard
6 drive.

7 MR. HALL: Yeah. I pulled the hard drive.

8 [REDACTED] -- because I want to --

9 (Multiple voices.)

10 MR. HALL: Yeah. I've got all my
11 customers' financial --

12 [REDACTED] All that stuff --

13 MR. HALL: -- history and stuff on it.

14 No, I --

15 (Multiple voices.)

16 [REDACTED] -- where's the hard drive?

17 MR. HALL: Dumpster. Landfill.

18 [REDACTED] You threw the hard drive
19 away?

20 MR. HALL: Well, we destroyed it.

21 [REDACTED] I thought you said it had all
22 your customer stuff on that.

23 MR. HALL: Yeah, I just -- I destroyed the
24 hard drive.

25 [REDACTED] Okay. So you pulled the hard

1 drive.

2 MR. HALL: I mean, I backed it up,
3 obviously.

4 [REDACTED] So that's what I'm asking --

5 MR. HALL: All my client files and
6 QuickBooks and all that stuff --

7 [REDACTED] So where would that backup
8 be? Where would that data be? Where would the
9 backup for that hard drive be?

10 MR. HALL: On my new computer.

11 [REDACTED] On this computer. Okay.

12 [REDACTED] The reason we ask is because if
13 those e-mails are somehow fictitious, like you didn't
14 make the threats, that can help us piece the puzzle
15 together to be able to identify that, right, and
16 verify that you weren't the one that actually --

17 (Multiple voices.)

18 MR. HALL: So the only thing that I can
19 think of is to log into that e-mail and let's look at
20 it because I can tell you unequivocally,
21 categorically, however -- whatever dramatic word we
22 want to use here, I did not threaten him with that
23 stuff in those e-mails. I don't know how you got
24 that. I don't know where that came from --

25 [REDACTED] Well, and again --

1 MR. HALL: I did --

2 (Multiple voices.)

3 [REDACTED] We have threats and we have
4 threats in the packages and we -- that's what I'm
5 saying, okay.

6 MR. HALL: So let me -- let me give you
7 one more --

8 (Multiple voices.)

9 [REDACTED] And we don't need you to log
10 in because we -- we have that.

11 MR. HALL: Because I would love to log
12 in --

13 (Multiple voices.)

14 [REDACTED] We have that --

15 MR. HALL: -- with you guys sitting here
16 --

17 [REDACTED] It doesn't matter.

18 MR. HALL: Let's go look at it.

19 [REDACTED] It doesn't matter. Okay
20 we're not -- we don't need to do that. We already
21 have it.

22 MR. HALL: Okay. I'm just telling you --

23 [REDACTED] Yeah. We already have it, so
24 --

25 MR. HALL: The e-mails I sent him --

1 [REDACTED] Uh-huh (affirmative).

2 MR. HALL: -- did not contain that
3 language you just read me.

4 [REDACTED] Okay. And letters you sent,
5 do you have any original -- originals of those stored
6 on this hard drive?

7 MR. HALL: What do you mean letters? Oh,
8 like, the little notes?

9 [REDACTED] Yeah. With the threats, the
10 notes -- the notes to the packages --

11 MR. HALL: The picture that you have right
12 there, thought this might help, that was it, that was
13 the thing I sent with it.

14 [REDACTED] Okay.

15 MR. HALL: So you're saying there was
16 another letter in there.

17 [REDACTED] No. No. No. No. No. No.
18 No.

19 MR. HALL: Or was it on the back of that?

20 [REDACTED] We're not talking about one
21 threat. I mean -- I mean, there were multiple --

22 MR. HALL: Okay.

23 [REDACTED] -- letters or packages that
24 had threats in them, so --

25 MR. HALL: So let me -- okay. So let me

1 --

2 (Multiple voices.)

3 MR. HALL: Let me --

4 ██████████ If you have originals of
5 those.

6 MR. HALL: I don't. That was months ago,
7 a different computer.

8 ██████████ Well, it was. And again, at
9 that point, we're trying to help you -- if what
10 you're claiming is true, then --

11 MR. HALL: Help you out -- no, I get what
12 you're asking.

13 ██████████ But what you're saying is you
14 don't have that. I mean, you destroyed -- you got
15 rid of the hard drive, you -- it's gone.

16 MR. HALL: Yeah.

17 ██████████ Is what you're saying?

18 MR. HALL: Yeah. So -- another little
19 tidbit that you might be interested in. And again,
20 this is hearsay and so you may need to conduct your
21 own investigations into this to -- to figure out how
22 much of this is true or not. But my wife was talking
23 to councilwoman ██████████ and base -- and she had
24 said -- and they were talking about, again, these
25 death threats. And I think this was when my wife

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1 said, "Oh, hey, by the way that box that showed up
2 last year with the baby gifts and all that, that was
3 my husband." And they're like --

4 [REDACTED] Did she tell somebody that?

5 MR. HALL: My wife?

6 [REDACTED] Yeah.

7 MR. HALL: Yeah. She told all the council
8 people.

9 [REDACTED] Okay. When did she tell them
10 that?

11 MR. HALL: Oh, January something.

12 So she basically said, "Hey, by the way,
13 that was my husband," you know, basically trying to
14 get ahead of the fallout from it or whatever.

15 So [REDACTED] tells her, he -- she says, "So, I
16 was actually sitting in a meeting prior to our
17 council meeting starting when" -- and Jeff,
18 apparently, was, you know, his assigned seat was next
19 to her when he opened up a letter -- he said, now --
20 she said, "Here's the weird part. Jeff will
21 typically take mail and open it with, like, two pens
22 and, like, not touch it like he's afraid of anthrax
23 or something, I don't know. But he's very obvious
24 about his -- you know, not touching letters and doing
25 this kind of stuff." She's like, "It was really

1 weird."

2 And one day he -- he shows up, opens up
3 this letter and goes, "Oh, there you go, see." And
4 hands her this horrible death threat.

5 And she's like, "It was nasty." She was
6 like, "If I had gotten that, I would have shut the
7 meeting down, like, called the police or whatever."
8 She's like, "It was -- it was bad."

9 [REDACTED] And who is this?

10 MR. HALL: [REDACTED]

11 [REDACTED] Okay.

12 MR. HALL: And so she's telling that, she
13 goes he -- she -- and the point was she goes -- but
14 the point was is that, normally, he makes this big
15 show of opening up, you know, letters and then this
16 time he just opens up and goes, "Oh, look." She
17 goes, that was a little --

18 [REDACTED] When was that?

19 MR. HALL: Oh, I don't know when it was.

20 [REDACTED] Okay.

21 MR. HALL: She just mentioned -- she was
22 just telling him the story that he -- it looked like
23 he was staging -- "Oh, see. See what I'm getting.
24 See what I'm getting." Staging death threats.

25 [REDACTED] Okay.

1 MR. HALL: So --

2 [REDACTED] Just real quick, what's the
3 combination to your safe in there?

4 MR. HALL: [REDACTED].

5 [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Okay.

6 MR. HALL: I think. You can always
7 remember when you're actually looking at it and doing
8 it.

9 [REDACTED] Well --

10 MR. HALL: Anyway, so --

11 [REDACTED] Do you have any other computers
12 other than the one that's in there?

13 No, that's the only one?

14 MR. HALL: No.

15 [REDACTED] Okay. Does your wife know about
16 the e-mail side of things?

17 MR. HALL: She does not.

18 (Multiple voices.)

19 MR. HALL: No.

20 [REDACTED] Okay.

21 [REDACTED] Did she know you were sending
22 it while you were sending it?

23 MR. HALL: The e-mails?

24 [REDACTED] Any of this?

25 MR. HALL: No. No.

1 [REDACTED] When did -- so when did she
2 find out?

3 MR. HALL: Just in January.

4 [REDACTED] After the [REDACTED] thing and
5 then you told her?

6 MR. HALL: Yeah. Yeah. She had no idea.

7 [REDACTED] And no one else --

8 MR. HALL: For very obvious reasons.

9 [REDACTED] Yeah. And I don't blame you.
10 No one else knows then, right?

11 MR. HALL: No. No. I had kept that
12 pretty close to the chest just because, frankly, I
13 didn't want that to come out and then have blow-back
14 on her.

15 [REDACTED] Yeah. No, I get that.

16 MR. HALL: So here we are.

17 [REDACTED] Well, and [REDACTED] got -- he
18 did get pulled into it.

19 (Multiple voices.)

20 MR. HALL: Yeah.

21 [REDACTED] -- for him.

22 MR. HALL: That's the unfortunate thing.
23 And I know with his -- with his past, he's a
24 vulnerable -- you know, that makes him vulnerable for
25 a lot of stuff but --

1 [REDACTED] What do you mean?

2 MR. HALL: Oh, you know, he -- his past
3 criminal record that, I guess, it makes it easy to go
4 --

5 [REDACTED] Well, no, we don't target
6 people for their criminal -- we target them for what
7 they do.

8 MR. HALL: Yeah.

9 [REDACTED] And he -- he was involved in
10 this, so --

11 MR. HALL: Yeah, he was.

12 [REDACTED] So, it's not --

13 MR. HALL: But --

14 [REDACTED] I don't care if he's a felon
15 -- you're not a felon.

16 MR. HALL: Right.

17 [REDACTED] But you're involved in it.
18 (Multiple voices.)

19 [REDACTED] We don't target -- we didn't
20 look [REDACTED] up and just go target him because he's a
21 felon.

22 MR. HALL: No, I understand.

23 [REDACTED] There's a lot of felons out
24 there, so don't --

25 MR. HALL: I understand. I feel bad --

1 well, but because of his past --

2 [REDACTED] It's not good for him to be
3 involved in this.

4 MR. HALL: Yeah.

5 [REDACTED] I think he's on -- is he on
6 probation? I think he's on probation, which is not
7 good.

8 MR. HALL: I thought he got off probation
9 years ago. I don't -- I don't know. I don't keep up
10 with his status on things but --

11 (Multiple voices.)

12 [REDACTED] Do you have the passcode to your
13 phone?

14 [REDACTED] We have it.

15 MR. HALL: Yeah. You got it.

16 [REDACTED] I gave -- are they asking for
17 it?

18 [REDACTED] No. I just wanted to clarify.
19 Yeah.

20 [REDACTED] Yeah. I mean, we'll see how
21 this shakes out but -- I appreciate you chatting with
22 us. Again, I'm glad you did, okay, because it this
23 is the only chance you're going to have to tell us
24 your side of this.

25 MR. HALL: Like I said --

1 [REDACTED] That's where the benefit --
2 (Multiple voices.)

3 MR. HALL: I've got nothing to hide.

4 [REDACTED] Okay.

5 MR. HALL: I mean, you guys know, you saw
6 the crap I sent to him, all the gag gifts and the
7 needling and the poking and the e-mails. But I mean
8 -- have you got printouts of the e-mails?

9 [REDACTED] I don't have them here, no.
10 I don't have them right here.

11 MR. HALL: Because I would like to get
12 those and you and I read through them together.

13 [REDACTED] I'm not going to sit down
14 with you and read through them together. Okay.
15 We've -- I'm telling you what we've done and --

16 MR. HALL: Okay. Well, I'm telling you --
17 (Multiple voices.)

18 MR. HALL: -- something is off here.

19 [REDACTED] Okay. Okay.

20 MR. HALL: Because the language -- what
21 was the language you wrote or the --

22 [REDACTED] We'll look at them. We'll
23 look at them. It's fine.

24 MR. HALL: Absolutely --

25 [REDACTED] If you were charged --

1 (Multiple voices.)

2 MR. HALL: -- never threaten his life --

3 [REDACTED] Which you're not charged with
4 a crime yet, okay. And that's not our decision.
5 That's a prosecutor's decision. But if you were,
6 then you'll get everything we have. Your attorney
7 will get in discovery, everything we have and how we
8 got it and where it -- where it came from and what it
9 says and it comes from the source, okay.

10 That's why we go to the source. That's
11 why we don't rely on just what a victim says or what
12 an alleged victim says, we go to the source with
13 court orders and that's what we're serving here.

14 MR. HALL: Yeah.

15 [REDACTED] So, again -- so, we're -- we
16 have to tell you we've served the warrant. So we
17 have served the warrant on your --

18 (Multiple voices.)

19 [REDACTED] We served the warrant on the
20 [REDACTED] account. And then again, this is [REDACTED] and
21 we have to give -- is he here today or is he around?

22 MR. HALL: He's probably here.

23 [REDACTED] Okay. Because we need to
24 give him a copy of that, too.

25 [REDACTED] What -- what's the password to

1 that [REDACTED] e-mail account?

2 MALE SPEAKER: I'm going to step out for a
3 minute.

4 MALE SPEAKER: Yeah. Okay.

5 (Multiple voices.)

6 MR. HALL: I am trying to remember -- I
7 think I had it written down on a little piece of
8 paper and then I tossed it when we moved because at
9 that point I'm like, I'm done with this -- horsing
10 around with that guy.

11 [REDACTED] Do you have an idea of what it
12 might be?

13 MR. HALL: It might be [REDACTED], yeah,
14 with a capital [REDACTED]. And if it's not that, I don't -- I
15 don't know what it is. And I -- honestly, I may have
16 deleted that account. I mean, I'm sure G-mail still
17 has copies of all the crap but --

18 [REDACTED] I'm just trying to piece
19 together because if nobody else knew about that
20 e-mail account and no one else had access to it, how
21 would they infiltrate that and make the threats that
22 you're claiming you didn't make along with the
23 e-mails that you did send? Does that make sense?

24 MR. HALL: I -- I don't know what's going
25 on here. What I'm telling you is what he just read

1 me was not in those e-mails.

2 [REDACTED] Right.

3 MR. HALL: That's --

4 (Multiple voices.)

5 MR. HALL: There was nothing -- and did
6 you guys get that -- where did that information come
7 from? That is absolutely false.

8 [REDACTED] So like he was mentioning in
9 these scenarios, right, if we have a case involving a
10 G-mail account, aside from getting what this guy
11 gives us, we go to Google with a search warrant and
12 we say, "We want records pertaining to this." So
13 what Google gets us -- because that way, we're able
14 to get evidence from a neutral source.

15 (Multiple voices.)

16 MR. HALL: Which you've told me you've
17 already done that.

18 [REDACTED] Correct. And that's where those
19 threats --

20 MR. HALL: And you've got copies of the
21 original e-mails that were sent.

22 [REDACTED] Yes. Yes. According --

23 MR. HALL: You have that somewhere.

24 [REDACTED] According to the investigator.
25 Yes.

1 I'm not the case agent on this, as I
2 mentioned before. [REDACTED] is one of them and that's
3 where some of that information came from. So that's
4 what we're trying to piece together is how -- how did
5 that happen?

6 MR. HALL: What I'm telling you is I don't
7 think it did.

8 [REDACTED] So you think we're lying about
9 the --

10 MR. HALL: I think someone has got mixed
11 -- mixed up information here. Because if he just
12 read me what was being purported by -- and I know
13 there's a lot of people in your organization, people
14 doing their different jobs. That language was not in
15 any of the e-mails. I've never said that to a single
16 person in my life.

17 [REDACTED] Okay.

18 MR. HALL: That's not my nature.

19 If you guys want to go and it's all being
20 recorded so you can hash over this later, if you guys
21 want to go and pour over those e-mails, you'll find
22 that the tone is, in a nutshell, and I'm
23 paraphrasing, "Stop being a dick in our city council
24 meetings. Get back to, you know, civil discourse.
25 Stop threatening the mayor. Stop" -- this is before

1 my wife was the mayor, you know. "Stop threatening
2 everybody and how about just be a good public
3 servant. And if you don't, I'm going to make a big
4 fat effort to make sure you don't get reelected."
5 That was the tone of the e-mail.

6 And I -- and then I'd slip in there, "Oh,
7 and if you don't, I'm going to -- I'm going to kill
8 you" -- you know, that doesn't fit or jive with any
9 of it.

10 So you guys go back, do your -- do your --
11 [REDACTED] See -- I see what you're saying.
12 MR. HALL: -- review.

13 [REDACTED] I see what you're saying. But
14 when those things pop up, we just have to get answers
15 to those questions. And we have --

16 (Multiple voices.)

17 [REDACTED] -- we have forensic experts that
18 can go through there and help us with that stuff to
19 see if somehow there was a mistake or if somehow
20 somebody did infiltrate and try to add that stuff to
21 the e-mails --

22 MR. HALL: No, I'm just saying I think his
23 report that whatever he's reading off of right there
24 was something else. That was not in my e-mails. And
25 whatever note Jeff Gaston is saying was threatening

1 his life that showed up with that package is
2 blatantly false.

3 [REDACTED] Okay.

4 MR. HALL: Absolutely. And if you want to
5 take the two of us and put us on a lie detector test
6 side by side, let's do it.

7 [REDACTED] Okay.

8 MR. HALL: And we'll see -- we'll see
9 which one comes out right.

10 [REDACTED] Is that something you would be
11 interested in doing, a polygraph?

12 MR. HALL: Sure.

13 [REDACTED] Okay.

14 MR. HALL: If he's sitting right next to
15 me, you bet.

16 [REDACTED] Only if he's doing it with you.

17 MR. HALL: You bet.

18 [REDACTED] Okay. So if he -- because we
19 can't force him to take a polygraph. But in the
20 event that he was like, "I don't want to," would you
21 be willing to do one just to show some innocence
22 and --

23 MR. HALL: Yeah.

24 [REDACTED] I mean -- okay.

25 MR. HALL: To -- to show that I -- to show

1 that I absolutely didn't send that, you bet.

2 ██████████ Okay.

3 MR. HALL: But I want him to take one too.

4 ██████████ Okay.

5 MR. HALL: Because here is what I think is
6 happening. I think he's falsifying information to
7 you. And if that happens, then my question is: What
8 are you guys doing to do about it? My guess is your
9 office takes a dim view of people wasting your time
10 on --

11 ██████████ Well, aside from --

12 MR. HALL: -- fraudulent claims.

13 ██████████ Yeah. Aside from wasting our
14 time, if you're creating fictitious evidence and
15 making false claims, that is a crime in and of
16 itself. So, if that's --

17 MR. HALL: And I think -- I think that's
18 what's happening here.

19 ██████████ And I'm sure the case agent on
20 this will make sure he's aware of that and he can go
21 that route, too, so --

22 MR. HALL: Yeah. You want to put us both
23 on a polygraph. But absolutely, I have never
24 threatened his life. And it doesn't even -- it
25 doesn't even follow motive that I sent him a gag gift

1 to needle him and make fun of him, "Oh, and I'm going
2 to kill you." It kind of ruins the joke.

3 [REDACTED] Did it ever get back to him that
4 you were the one that was sending those packages or
5 the e-mails or anything like that?

6 MR. HALL: I'm sure he knows now.

7 The e-mails, probably not. But the
8 packages, everybody at city hall knows now, so I'm
9 sure it's made its way back to him.

10 [REDACTED] Okay.

11 MR. HALL: He avoids me like the plague
12 ever since our little confrontation at town days back
13 in the summer. He avoids me.

14 [REDACTED] Okay.

15 MR. HALL: I'm not afraid of him. And he
16 acts like such a bully and tyrant and threatens
17 people all over the place that they just kind of back
18 off but I'm not afraid of a guy like that.

19 [REDACTED] Okay.

20 MR. HALL: So I don't know.

21 [REDACTED] All right. Just got to hang out
22 here for a little bit until they finish up and then
23 we'll get out of here.

24 (Discussion off the record.)

25 MR. HALL: This whole thing is going to

1 take a very different direction once you get to the
2 bottom of it.

3 So, what's the process here? Are they
4 taking everyone's computers?

5 [REDACTED] No.

6 MR. HALL: Or are they just after mine?

7 [REDACTED] Just after yours.

8 MR. HALL: All right.

9 [REDACTED] I know it's an inconvenience,
10 but --

11 MR. HALL: Well --

12 [REDACTED] Ultimately, sometimes, when we
13 -- when we show up to do search warrants like these
14 to collect evidence, people think that we're -- we're
15 just out to get them or we're trying to screw them
16 over or we're trying to find proof they --

17 (Multiple voices.)

18 MR. HALL: I understand you guys are all
19 doing your job.

20 (Multiple voices.)

21 MR. HALL: I'm looking --

22 [REDACTED] The other side of this, though,
23 is we take this because we are the neutral fact
24 finders, right? We don't have anything to gain or
25 lose with your situation with your wife --

1 MR. HALL: Right.

2 (Multiple voices.)

3 [REDACTED] -- and so when we seize your
4 computer, it's not because we're trying to find
5 something that incriminates you. It's because we
6 also want to find something that maybe exonerates
7 you, right? We can show that the computer is
8 connected to the e-mail, right? And therefore, we go
9 through that stuff to try to determine if you really
10 did send those e-mails or if you, in fact, didn't or
11 if -- you know, if the originals -- because computers
12 save all sorts of data and information, you know. If
13 the e-mails were somehow altered or if there was a
14 mistake -- so that's why we -- we take that stuff.

15 MR. HALL: Yeah. No, I mean, I got
16 nothing to hide on any of this. I don't really care.
17 I can handle my own -- results of my own actions but
18 when it starts affecting all my people and I can't
19 run payroll that's -- that's when it's a problem.
20 Anyway, that's where it gets problematic.

21 I'm guessing I'm not going to get my
22 computer back by next Wednesday.

23 [REDACTED] It depends. Honestly, I don't
24 know.

25 MR. HALL: I think you guys have had the

1 other guy's stuff since December.

2 [REDACTED] Yeah. So this -- like he
3 mentioned, this is kind of, like, the last step.
4 Usually, when we have an active investigation, we
5 don't like to return and release things before the
6 actual thing is concluded because sometimes we do
7 have to go back, if it's something we've already
8 looked at and we develop new information and stuff
9 like that, right? So I think your scenario is going
10 to be a little bit different than -- than his. Yours
11 is at the tail end versus we seized his earlier on in
12 the investigation, so -- but it's been noted that,
13 you know, that's your business computer and you have
14 your business essentials on there, so --

15 (Multiple voices.)

16 MR. HALL: This will -- this will cause
17 significant harm to -- well, my employees, really,
18 that's what it comes down to is --

19 [REDACTED] How many employees do you have?

20 MR. HALL: Usually around 23, 24.

21 [REDACTED] Okay.

22 MR. HALL: Yeah.

23 [REDACTED] And you do all the payroll
24 stuff?

25 MR. HALL: I do.

1 [REDACTED] On your own.

2 MR. HALL: Yep. So this is the super
3 awkward part where you just get to sit here and wait.

4 [REDACTED] Uh-huh (affirmative).

5 MR. HALL: I mean for you.

6 [REDACTED] Yeah.

7 MR. HALL: You have to just sit here and
8 wait with the --

9 [REDACTED] Yep.

10 (Multiple voices.)

11 MR. HALL: -- with the detained.

12 [REDACTED] Okay. I think we're close to
13 done here.

14 So, real quick, so what computer did you
15 get rid of? Was it a desktop, laptop?

16 MR. HALL: It was a little desktop, yeah.

17 [REDACTED] So, [REDACTED] says this is your --
18 you guys haven't got a new desktop here. He says
19 this is the one you've had.

20 MR. HALL: No, that's -- that's my new --
21 the one that's in there is a little black thing.

22 [REDACTED] A little tower(ph), right?

23 MR. HALL: Yeah.

24 [REDACTED] So he says that that's not
25 new. He says that's the one from the --

1 MR. HALL: I don't know that he would
2 know.

3 [REDACTED] Well, he said all purchases
4 you guys discuss. Did you buy it using company
5 money?

6 MR. HALL: Yeah.

7 [REDACTED] I'm just saying what he said.
8 I'm trying to nail that down because --

9 MR. HALL: Yeah. No, I -- that's a new
10 computer as of a month or two ago.

11 [REDACTED] Okay. Did you -- did you
12 discuss that with him or not?

13 MR. HALL: No.

14 [REDACTED] He said you guys discuss that
15 stuff and he's certain it's not.

16 MR. HALL: We usually do.

17 [REDACTED] But you didn't?

18 MR. HALL: I mean, we discuss, normally,
19 big purchases but I don't think I discussed that with
20 him.

21 Moving into a new building, we had a lot
22 of moving parts and there was a lot of chaos going
23 on.

24 [REDACTED] So that is -- that is a new
25 --

1 MR. HALL: That's a new --
2 [REDACTED] And when we get into it,
3 we'll be able to see if it's new or not. I'm just
4 asking -- I'm trying to confirm what he's saying with
5 what you're saying. You're saying that is a --
6 MR. HALL: He's out of the loop. Yeah.
7 [REDACTED] Okay. All right.
8 MR. HALL: No, that's a new computer.
9 [REDACTED] And that's not unbelievable.
10 I think that makes sense, so --
11 Okay. Do you have any questions?
12 [REDACTED] Huh-uh (negative).
13 MR. HALL: So the only thing that I'm
14 going to point out on, you know, with this -- have
15 you read through the e-mails from that [REDACTED]?
16 [REDACTED] Just a second.
17 Okay. So you mentioned [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] the
18 case agent on this.
19 MR. HALL: Uh-huh (affirmative).
20 [REDACTED] Okay. I'm not. Neither is
21 [REDACTED]. Okay. [REDACTED] is talking to your wife right now,
22 so that's where he is. That's why he's not here
23 talking to you.
24 MR. HALL: Okay.
25 [REDACTED] So I'll tell him what you

1 said, okay. We've got it recorded. I'll provide
2 that to him and -- and he'll look in all that.

3 Trust me, we don't want to charge somebody
4 if they didn't do something. Okay. You may think
5 that we will but we don't. We don't want to do that,
6 okay. Our job isn't to arrest people, it's to get to
7 the truth, whatever that is. We have no allegiance
8 to this guy. Again, we've never met him in person.

9 MR. HALL: Sure.

10 [REDACTED] Okay. So we want to get to
11 the -- the truth. And so that's what our job is.

12 So I'll let [REDACTED] know what you've said.
13 We'll provide him with the --

14 MR. HALL: Would it be inappropriate to
15 say hi to my wife through [REDACTED]?

16 [REDACTED] Yeah.

17 (Multiple voices.)

18 [REDACTED] You'll be able to talk to her
19 here in a minute.

20 MALE SPEAKER: If she wants to talk to
21 you.

22 MR. HALL: Right. Yeah. That may be the
23 question, huh?

24 She's known this was all a possibility,
25 so --

1 [REDACTED] Yeah.

2 (Discussion off the record.)

3 MALE SPEAKER: Are these different?

4 [REDACTED] Yeah. There should be one --
5 well, you might have -- you might have two copies of
6 the same one but one of them should be for an e-mail
7 account, I believe.

8 MR. HALL: Oh, yeah.

9 [REDACTED] So the [REDACTED] and then the
10 personal and then the business, all that stuff.

11 MR. HALL: Why is that one even tied into
12 it; just because [REDACTED] is involved in it?

13 [REDACTED] Yeah. I -- honestly, I don't
14 know about that one.

15 MR. HALL: Yeah. Are these all for me?

16 [REDACTED] Yeah. Yeah. Those are all your
17 copies.

18 And if they do end up taking things,
19 they'll provide you with a list of the items that
20 they took so you'll have a receipt.

21 MR. HALL: Well, yeah, not going to matter
22 what I tell you but I'm just telling you --

23 [REDACTED] Of course it matters.

24 MR. HALL: It does matter what I tell you?

25 [REDACTED] Yeah. That's why we -- if it

1 didn't then why would we be here?

2 (Multiple voices.)

3 MR. HALL: So I don't know what else
4 you've got tied to the -- the stuff in the box, you
5 know, all the baby gift bags and all that kind of
6 stuff. But the one thing where it said -- he said
7 showed up in a package.

8 [REDACTED] Uh-huh (affirmative).

9 MR. HALL: That is false. That is
10 absolutely a falsification. Now, how do you prove
11 that? Who knows.

12 [REDACTED] Yeah.

13 MR. HALL: Put us both in a room with a
14 lie detector test.

15 [REDACTED] Well, you mentioned that and
16 that might be a possibility here at some point.

17 MR. HALL: But I'm just telling you, that
18 dude is falsifying stuff to gain some street cred, to
19 get somebody to believe him, to throw the scent off
20 -- you know, to make him not look like a fool in
21 front of other people. I don't know what it is but
22 that is -- if he told you that that showed up with
23 that package, that is an absolute, blatant lie.

24 [REDACTED] Understood.

25 MR. HALL: And so any other -- which --

1 you know, maybe that calls into question any other
2 supposed death threats that he's gotten but -- and if
3 there's somebody really threatening his life, that's
4 horrible. There's no call for that, no excuse for
5 that. Absolutely. But I'm telling you what, that
6 crap didn't come from me. I'm not interested in
7 threatening a guy's life. I just wanted to make fun
8 of him.

9 [REDACTED] Fair enough.

10 MR. HALL: So I hope you guys look into
11 that. I hope it gets -- I hope that gets as much
12 attention as this is all getting because --

13 [REDACTED] Yeah. Like I said, [REDACTED] is the
14 case agent on it and he's asked us to help by coming
15 here and interviewing you and we'll provide that
16 information to him and he'll go where he goes with
17 that afterwards but --

18 MR. HALL: I hope so. I hope he does.

19 I hope somebody goes back through those
20 e-mails. If you guys have access to the actual
21 servers, you know, to the -- the copies provided by
22 Google, read through those e-mails. That language is
23 not in there. I did not send that, so --

24 I have a hunch that somebody was provided
25 with printed copies that said something to that

1 effect.

2 [REDACTED] It's a possibility from the
3 initial report that the accuser could have provided
4 printed copies like that. But, again, that's why we
5 get court orders to get documents from the actual --

6 MR. HALL: Yeah.

7 [REDACTED] -- entity themselves. So, I
8 personally haven't reviewed the ones from Google but
9 that's what we've been told that we have those and
10 that's what they did say, so.

11 MR. HALL: Yeah. Something -- something
12 is wrong there. That -- that just didn't happen. So
13 -- but I'm guessing you guys will do your jobs and
14 get to the bottom of it.

15 We'll see if I need to find a place to
16 sleep tonight.

17 [REDACTED] Yeah. She'll be upset.

18 She figure --

19 MR. HALL: She loves being embarrassed and
20 having undue attention and -- oh, boy, does she love
21 that.

22 [REDACTED] And you -- you said that she
23 figured this was going to happen, law enforcement
24 would show up at some point and --

25 MR. HALL: Well, I -- I told her. I said

1 this -- this happened to [REDACTED], it's going to take a
2 hot second to, you know, connect that stuff back to
3 me. And clearly, they think somebody is actually
4 making death threats so, yeah, they're going to come
5 talk to me at some point. So I'm surprised it took
6 this long.

7 Like I said, I reached out to my attorney
8 and I said, "Call up [REDACTED]. Let's -- let's go
9 in and have a sit down. And he said, well -- and so
10 he reached out and I think he said he had to call
11 four or five times before he finally got a call back
12 but --

13 [REDACTED] No information on that.

14 MR. HALL: Yeah. I don't know. No -- as
15 soon as I find out the -- I mean, we're tossing out
16 houses and that kind of stuff to get information
17 about poking fun at a guy, like, yeah, something's
18 off here. Let's get to the bottom of it and figure
19 out what's going on because I think this guy is
20 making fraudulent claims that it's death threats and
21 now he's --

22 [REDACTED] He will, hopefully --

23 MR. HALL: -- bringing in innocent people
24 like [REDACTED] that had nothing --

25 [REDACTED] Hopefully --

1 (Multiple voices.)

2 [REDACTED] Hopefully it makes sense now why
3 we take it a bit more seriously than sending little
4 -- you know --

5 (Multiple voices.)

6 MR. HALL: That was the only thing I
7 supposed is -- and Natalie told me, my wife Natalie,
8 she said, "Yeah, the -- this other council lady said
9 she saw a death threat that was mailed to him that he
10 happened to open at a council meeting that was
11 horrible."

12 [REDACTED] [REDACTED] --

13 MR. HALL: [REDACTED], yeah.

14 She said, "You know, it totally looked
15 staged that he opened it up right in front of her at
16 that time," like -- anyway.

17 [REDACTED] Yeah.

18 MR. HALL: That was her general impression
19 that it was kind of like, it's a little suspicious
20 that you open that up right in front of me but --
21 anyway -- anyway --

22 (Discussion off the record.)

23 [REDACTED] Was your wife on city council
24 prior to mayor?

25 MR. HALL: No, she was an emergency

1 manager.

2 [REDACTED] Oh, okay.

3 MR. HALL: Yeah. Just worked for the city
4 part-time.

5 [REDACTED] Is it a pretty intensive job,
6 being the mayor out there? I know it's a smaller
7 jurisdiction but --

8 MR. HALL: I mean, she's only into it a
9 couple months but she seems to enjoy it. It's -- I
10 mean, the mayor in our town is a -- what's called a
11 weak mayor, so she doesn't have a vote --

12 (Multiple voices.)

13 [REDACTED] -- city manager --

14 (Multiple voices.)

15 MR. HALL: Yeah, we have a city manager.
16 And so he does the day-to-day, you know, management
17 of the city. And our mayor -- mayor's role in our
18 town is mostly just kind of a PR thing, you go out,
19 you attend all the meetings and work with other
20 mayors and try to secure funding for projects and all
21 that kind of thing, so -- cutting red tapes, kissing
22 babies.

23 [REDACTED] Fun stuff.

24 MR. HALL: No, she's -- she's enjoying it
25 so far. Maybe not today as much.

1 Oh, boy.

2 Nothing like being an embarrassment to
3 your wife.

4 [REDACTED] Yeah. That will be a fun
5 conversation.

6 MR. HALL: We've already had the
7 conversation. She figured this would probably come
8 at some point, but -- the bigger thing is, yeah, if
9 he's falsifying threats and trying to go after people
10 for making fun of him --

11 [REDACTED] Creating false --

12 MR. HALL: -- now we've got a crime.

13 (Multiple voices.)

14 [REDACTED] -- that's a crime.

15 My only crime was maybe in bad taste.

16 [REDACTED] All right. Okay.

17 MR. HALL: Got it all figured out?

18 [REDACTED] What's that?

19 We're about done.

20 MR. HALL: All right.

21 [REDACTED] This is a property receipt
22 form. One is for us, one is for you. It just has
23 the items that we're taking.

24 As far as the computer goes, we are going
25 to take that and we'll image it. So, we'll take an

1 image of the hard drive. For us to return the actual
2 tower(ph) to you, we have to have the prosecutor sign
3 off on that because that is the original source of
4 the evidence.

5 MR. HALL: Sure.

6 [REDACTED] But -- and they're going to
7 talk to [REDACTED] about it, too, what's on it. And we can
8 either -- if they sign off on us returning it, then
9 we'll get it back to you here in the next couple
10 days.

11 MR. HALL: That would be really helpful.

12 [REDACTED] And because we have your
13 phone, we'll just call [REDACTED] and you guys -- does that
14 work?

15 MR. HALL: Yeah. How long you guys have
16 my phone?

17 [REDACTED] We're probably going to have
18 your phone for a bit.

19 MR. HALL: What does that mean?

20 [REDACTED] Probably indefinitely. It
21 depends on what -- but the same thing, we're not
22 going to image it and give it back, okay. We're
23 going to image it and make sure there's no evidence
24 on it because if there is evidence on it, we keep the
25 original source of the evidence.

1 MR. HALL: So I probably need to get a new
2 phone?

3 [REDACTED] Probably. Yeah.

4 MR. HALL: All right.

5 [REDACTED] But again, with the computer,
6 if -- if they sign off on it then we'll get it back
7 to you. If they don't, then we've asked [REDACTED] And
8 again, you guys can work on -- make a list of what --
9 what is on it that you need and we could probably
10 extract that and -- and get it to you if you bring
11 us, like, a hard drive or something like that but
12 yeah, we'll work that out. Hopefully we can give it
13 back to you.

14 MR. HALL: The QuickBooks has online
15 backups, which should be fairly recent. I mean, the
16 main thing is it's -- well -- yeah. It's just the
17 QuickBooks. I have to install that on a whole other
18 computer, so -- yeah.

19 [REDACTED] Well.

20 MR. HALL: Image that thing. The -- if we
21 can get it back, that would really help.

22 [REDACTED] If -- if --

23 MR. HALL: Not be burden to --

24 (Multiple voices.)

25 [REDACTED] If the prosecutor is good

1 with it, we have no problem with that.

2 MR. HALL: Sure.

3 [REDACTED] Okay. Once we image it, it's
4 just going to be up to what they -- and again, we're
5 not on any side of this. I hope you understand.

6 MR. HALL: No, I understand.

7 [REDACTED] I get it. I get the
8 frustration.

9 MR. HALL: I understand. And what --

10 [REDACTED] We're just doing our job,
11 trying to --

12 (Multiple voices.)

13 MR. HALL: [REDACTED] -- what [REDACTED] and I were
14 talking about is what I think is going on here is in
15 order to avoid looking like a fool and play the
16 victim, Jeff Gaston has falsified information and has
17 falsified these death threat -- maybe he's gotten
18 some but to tell you that that death threat showed up
19 in that package that I sent him -- I sent the
20 package. I sent the -- the coloring book.

21 [REDACTED] Uh-huh (affirmative).

22 MR. HALL: I sent the jester's hat. I
23 sent the thing. Absolutely. Did I sent a death
24 threat with that? No.

25 [REDACTED] Okay.

1 MR. HALL: So, if he's purporting -- if
2 he's proposing to you and telling you --

3 MALE SPEAKER: Sorry.

4 [REDACTED] Well, let me --
5 (Multiple voices.)

6 MR. HALL: -- that he did that --

7 [REDACTED] Do you have anything to
8 disprove -- because our job is not to take a
9 statement and a statement, our job is to take
10 statements and then establish corroborating
11 evidences.

12 MR. HALL: Sure.

13 [REDACTED] Okay. Do you have anything
14 to -- that could prove to us that what you're saying
15 is true?

16 And I'm asking that sincerely. Other than
17 --

18 MR. HALL: How can anyone --
19 (Multiple voices.)

20 [REDACTED] I don't know. That's what
21 I'm asking.

22 [REDACTED] Was anybody else there when you
23 packaged it up and sent it or --

24 MR. HALL: No. It was just me.

25 [REDACTED] Yeah. And that's what we're

1 asking. That's why we're asking about the hard
2 drive. That's why we're asking about original copies
3 of these drafts of documents.

4 MR. HALL: It would have been a document
5 that I printed and didn't even save. I mean, I would
6 have printed it and not even saved the file. I mean
7 --

8 [REDACTED] Okay. And again, we're
9 asking these questions to help you out.

10 MR. HALL: I understand. I understand.
11 (Multiple voices.)

12 [REDACTED] -- wrack your brain because
13 --

14 (Multiple voices.)

15 [REDACTED] I got to be honest, Jason, I
16 got to be honest --

17 MR. HALL: Yeah. Go ahead.

18 [REDACTED] -- just walking up and
19 saying, "I sent everything but I didn't send those
20 threats," that doesn't -- that doesn't mean a lot to
21 us until we can prove what you're saying is true.
22 Okay.

23 What we can do -- what we have done so far
24 is established what he's told us up to a certain
25 point is true because we've found corroborating

1 evidence to support what he's saying.

2 So that's what we're asking you is if
3 you've got something. But wrack your brain, this is
4 your time to tell us.

5 (Multiple voices.)

6 MR. HALL: That's -- that's like saying,
7 can you prove that you didn't do anything?

8 [REDACTED] You probably can't.

9 MR. HALL: Well --

10 (Multiple voices.)

11 MR. HALL: No.

12 [REDACTED] We're giving you -- we're
13 trying to help you wrack your brain --

14 (Multiple voices.)

15 MR. HALL: Shy of -- what I told [REDACTED] is
16 put us both in a room on a lie detector test. Let's
17 go.

18 [REDACTED] Okay.

19 MR. HALL: We'll do it this afternoon.

20 [REDACTED] You know, lie detector -- we
21 can't use that in court.

22 MR. HALL: Okay. Fine. Ask him if he'll
23 do it.

24 [REDACTED] Yeah. Again, lie detector,
25 we can't use that in court. I'm asking for

1 corroborating evidence, evidence that's supported in
2 court. That's what I'm asking.

3 MR. HALL: Right.

4 [REDACTED] That -- and --

5 MR. HALL: But what you're saying is that
6 his evidence of -- of sticking something in there
7 with it, I mean, what was it written on the back of
8 my paper that I printed --

9 [REDACTED] No. No. No. No. I'm
10 talking about he -- he claims he got certain e-mails,
11 we go to the original source of the e-mails and get
12 those e-mails and they corroborate what he told us.

13 MR. HALL: Okay. I did send him e-mails.

14 [REDACTED] Okay.

15 MR. HALL: But the e-mails did not have
16 that language in them that you read to me.

17 [REDACTED] Jason, I don't want to start
18 -- we're not going to dance again.

19 MR. HALL: Okay.

20 [REDACTED] What I'm trying to tell you
21 is if what you're claiming is true -- we don't know.
22 Okay. I don't know. Our job is not to -- to make
23 that judgment of truth. Our job is to gather
24 evidence and gather facts. Now, that is our job.

25 I'm not on his side of this. Okay. I

1 don't -- I don't care about that guy. I don't even
2 know him. I don't care.

3 MR. HALL: No, I get it.

4 [REDACTED] Neither does [REDACTED] Okay.
5 Frankly, I don't know you. Okay. I just -- I don't.
6 It --

7 MR. HALL: I feel like we know each other
8 now.

9 [REDACTED] Right. Sure. We know each
10 other real well.

11 But what I'm asking is -- is you're
12 claiming something -- you're giving a defense and
13 what we're asking is there -- is there any
14 corroborating evidence you can think of right now
15 while we're here that will support what you're
16 saying? Just like [REDACTED] said, somebody -- did -- did
17 you package it up with somebody? Did you save
18 copies? Did -- could there even be remnants of
19 copies on a hard drive you have? Is there -- that's
20 what we're -- that's why we're asking about those --
21 those hard drives.

22 MR. HALL: Yeah. I mean, if I had
23 something, I'd love to give it to you.

24 [REDACTED] That's -- that's what we're
25 asking.

1 MR. HALL: But I mean, you've got pictures
2 of when they -- as soon as -- you know, I recognize
3 the pictures of the stuff I sent. But do I -- have
4 you got pictures? Can I look at that --

5 [REDACTED] No.

6 MR. HALL: -- the stuff that you've got?

7 [REDACTED] No.

8 MR. HALL: Okay.

9 [REDACTED] We're done. We're done with
10 that. I just -- at this point we're giving you an
11 opportunity. If there's something to support what
12 you're saying.

13 MR. HALL: I don't --

14 (Multiple voices.)

15 MR. HALL: I don't think I have anything
16 to validate my -- I didn't send that part of it that
17 he's saying showed up with that package.

18 [REDACTED] Okay.

19 MR. HALL: But I'm just telling you --

20 [REDACTED] Okay.

21 MR. HALL: I didn't. And --

22 (Multiple voices.)

23 MR. HALL: And I hope you guys dig into it
24 because --

25 [REDACTED] We are. That's why we're

1 here, man.

2 MR. HALL: Yeah. Well --

3 [REDACTED] Is there anything to make you
4 think we're not digging into this?

5 MR. HALL: Well, here -- here's my point.
6 I hope this isn't a one-sided investigation that all
7 the sudden -- because I know I've committed no crime
8 other than against my wife. I told him I might need
9 to find a place to sleep tonight. We'll see.

10 But I've committed no crime other than
11 making fun of the guy. But if he's giving you false
12 evidence --

13 [REDACTED] That --

14 MR. HALL: -- now we got a crime, so --

15 [REDACTED] That's what I told you. That
16 would be a crime and we'll pass this along to [REDACTED]

17 MR. HALL: And I hope that gets
18 investigated because --

19 [REDACTED] We'll pass this along to [REDACTED] and
20 he can follow up on any leads if there are.

21 MALE SPEAKER: Okay.

22 MR. HALL: So you got my phone, computer,
23 thumb drive, another thumb drive, another thumb drive
24 and my case.

25 [REDACTED] So this computer is a new

1 one. Because, again, if you typed a document on a
2 computer, even if you didn't save it, our forensic
3 guys may be able to extract that document. So -- and
4 again, if you have an original version of -- of what
5 he's purporting is in this package --

6 MR. HALL: No.

7 [REDACTED] -- that -- that is what I'm
8 talking about. That's what I'm asking. Something --

9 MR. HALL: The old hard drive was
10 destroyed -- I mean, I've got --

11 (Multiple voices.)

12 [REDACTED] So when you say destroyed,
13 what do you mean?

14 MR. HALL: Like, physically.

15 [REDACTED] What did you do?

16 MR. HALL: Broken, ground up, chopped into
17 pieces.

18 [REDACTED] How did you destroy -- what
19 did you use to destroy it?

20 MR. HALL: A grinding disc.

21 [REDACTED] Okay.

22 MR. HALL: Yeah.

23 [REDACTED] And then you just threw it in
24 the trash.

25 MR. HALL: So, on my hard drives, we get

1 checks sent to us and then I print those off and run
2 them through my scanner. That's how -- I mean,
3 that's how we do it. So, on that hard drive there
4 was loads of checks --

5 [REDACTED] All that stuff.

6 (Multiple voices.)

7 MR. HALL: And you'll see the same thing
8 on this one. There's files where people are sending
9 me checks, I bring them in, I crop them and do the
10 thing and print them and scan them into the bank.

11 [REDACTED] When you --

12 MR. HALL: There's a lot of customer, you
13 know --

14 [REDACTED] And you said you backed it up
15 before you destroyed it, right? What did you do to
16 back it up?

17 MR. HALL: I backed up my QuickBooks and
18 my -- you know, any critical files that I needed and
19 all those would be on the --

20 [REDACTED] So not the hard drive. Like,
21 you didn't -- you didn't take the hard drive --

22 MR. HALL: No. No, I didn't do a -- I
23 didn't do --

24 [REDACTED] You didn't dump it onto an
25 external hard drive or something like that is what

1 I'm asking.

2 MR. HALL: No. No. That was a very old
3 computer and I grabbed the files I needed, stuff that
4 was critical and all that's on the new computer, so
5 --

6 [REDACTED] Did you delete anything off
7 your phone associated with this case? Text messages
8 -- again, it'll show this -- the reason I ask is we
9 already have texts on one side of the conversation.
10 So we have your texts to, like, say, [REDACTED] or maybe
11 other people. So, are we going to see those texts on
12 your phone or did you go through and delete them once
13 [REDACTED] talked to you? Which would make sense -- I
14 mean, that would be a logical move that any one of us
15 would make. I'm just asking --

16 (Multiple voices.)

17 MR. HALL: I don't think I deleted
18 anything. Not that I recall. Nothing significant.

19 [REDACTED] Well, and you would know,
20 right, in the last couple months if you deleted stuff
21 related to this case, right? I'm sure this has been
22 on your mind a little bit.

23 MR. HALL: Yeah. A little bit.

24 [REDACTED] Yeah. So did you delete
25 anything off the phone associated with this case?

1 Again, if you did, we're going to see it
2 on the back end. I'm just asking -- trying to
3 understand if you did and what was it so we can
4 verify and all that, so --

5 MR. HALL: Not really. Not that I can
6 think of.

7 ██████████ Okay. We've been cops for a
8 while and we do a lot of these interviews. When
9 somebody says, "Not really," that's not a -- that's
10 not a real solid answer --

11 MR. HALL: Well, I mean --

12 ██████████ -- when we're asking a
13 straightforward question.

14 ██████████ You know, like, is there
15 anything bad on your phone and they say, "There
16 shouldn't be" --

17 MALE SPEAKER: What did you guys find?

18 ██████████ If I ask somebody, "Is there
19 child pornography on your phone," and they say --

20 MR. HALL: I hope -- I hope not --

21 ██████████ If they say, "Not really,"
22 yeah, that's -- that's not a real answer.

23 And again, we're not asking did you delete
24 -- did you delete a photo that you took of your child
25 and such and such two years ago. We're not -- we're

1 talking in the last two or three months or, you know,
2 once [REDACTED] talked to you about this --

3 MR. HALL: Uh-huh (affirmative).

4 [REDACTED] -- did you go back and be
5 like, "Oh, I wonder -- you know, probably ought to
6 delete that or maybe delete this or is this still on
7 my phone? I could probably check it." Because
8 you're a smart guy, you --

9 MR. HALL: I had a list of --

10 (Multiple voices.)

11 [REDACTED] You kind of expected we were
12 going to be here.

13 MR. HALL: I had a list of clever things
14 -- of other gags that I --

15 [REDACTED] Were thinking about.

16 MR. HALL: -- had thought to send to Jeff
17 that I thought better of once I got a clear head.

18 [REDACTED] Did you delete that list?

19 MR. HALL: Yeah. Probably.

20 [REDACTED] Where do you keep these
21 lists? In your notes or --

22 MR. HALL: Yeah. In the notes.

23 [REDACTED] In the notes. Okay.

24 We know that because we actually have your
25 notes. Okay. Google provides those.

1 What were some of the other gags you were
2 considering?

3 MR. HALL: Well, at one point, I was going
4 to send him a -- I had bought some puppets, it was an
5 old guy and an old lady, which was the two candidates
6 he was supporting for mayor and for council.

7 [REDACTED] They were old.

8 MR. HALL: Yeah. There was, like, old --
9 like a grandma and grandpa --

10 [REDACTED] Okay.

11 MR. HALL: -- with a puppet string. I was
12 going to send that to a couple people at city hall,
13 you know, basically here's Jeff running -- pulling
14 the puppet strings because that's basically what was
15 going on there, at least that was my impression. I
16 thought better of that one, so I -- I ended up just
17 throwing them away.

18 [REDACTED] You bought all these on -- on
19 --

20 MR. HALL: Mostly just on Amazon.

21 [REDACTED] Amazon.

22 MR. HALL: Yeah.

23 [REDACTED] Okay.

24 MR. HALL: So, at one point, I had thought
25 to have a pile of manure dumped in front of his yard.

1 Thought better of that one, too.

2 [REDACTED] That's good that you didn't
3 do that. That's dirty business.

4 MR. HALL: Yeah. Well --

5 [REDACTED] Did your wife tell you, once
6 you told her, was she like, "You better stop"? I
7 mean, was she pretty adamant like, "Don't do this
8 anymore"?

9 MR. HALL: Yeah.

10 (Multiple voices.)

11 [REDACTED] Because [REDACTED] thinks it's all
12 pretty funny, which --

13 MR. HALL: Yeah.

14 [REDACTED] Which --

15 MR. HALL: Well, it is funny up until the
16 point it pisses my wife off.

17 [REDACTED] Right. Right.

18 MR. HALL: The whole thing is hilarious to
19 me up until the point when it causes my wife a
20 problem.

21 (Multiple voices.)

22 [REDACTED] Yeah.

23 [REDACTED] Because for you, it's funny and
24 for her, it probably looks unprofessional.

25 MR. HALL: It does. It looks

1 unprofessional. And that's the thing where, you
2 know, had she had nothing to do with politics, I'd
3 still -- I'd be laughing my guts out talking to you
4 guys right now. But it affects her and that's --
5 then it affects me, so --

6 [REDACTED] Do you have kids?

7 MR. HALL: Yeah. A whole bunch of them.

8 [REDACTED] How old -- you got a bunch?

9 MR. HALL: Five.

10 [REDACTED] What's the age range?

11 MR. HALL: We got two boys that are 22, an
12 18-year-old and [REDACTED]

13 [REDACTED]

14 [REDACTED] Is this -- do they know -- I
15 mean, is this something you guys joke about or --

16 MR. HALL: No.

17 [REDACTED] I'm sure you talk about him,
18 right, around the table? "This guy is a joke."

19 MR. HALL: No, not really because,
20 honestly, when the whole thing started when he
21 accused her of having an affair, that's when it got
22 --

23 [REDACTED] Which is low. I get why
24 you're pissed.

25 MR. HALL: That's pretty low.

1 [REDACTED] Yeah.

2 MR. HALL: Well, and so when that came
3 out, this -- that was -- I can't remember exactly

21 with anything we could, dereliction of duty, of

24 going to do an internal investigation." And she
25 talked to the city manager and he said the same

1 thing.

2 I mean, he was horrified. He's the bishop

25 with him by it text or by calls?

1 MR. HALL: I text him sometimes.

2 [REDACTED] Okay.

4 [REDACTED] Yeah. [REDACTED] like, "Tell Jeff
5 his attorney has never even tried to call me," so

Within 28 days after being notified by the officer that the transcript or recording is available, a witness may sign a statement of changes to the form or substance of the transcript or recording and the reasons for the changes. The officer shall append any changes timely made by the witness.
